As part of our Associate program, we provide a professional development context for you to leverage your academic skills and build your professional experience in advocacy, awareness, and capacity building.

Our previous Associates have been advocates on Capitol Hill, researched critical policy questions, represented the organization at conferences, organized logistics, collaborated with other NGOs, attended congressional hearings, built databases, and participated in “days in the city” where they toured and experienced cultural and historic environments in Washington D.C.

Each May, 21CWI hosts a week-long Emerging Leaders Conference in the Washington D.C. area that introduces you to the world of international religious freedom, gives you the skills you need to become a lifelong advocate, and is open to all undergraduate and graduate students with more information found at bit.ly/InformationPacket.



The internship’s scope of tasks and annual emerging leaders conference fall into three main categories:

ADVOCACY Working to research current legislative areas of interest, sitting in on hearings and public meetings on Capitol Hill, co-developing advocacy tools that will be used in Congress

POLICY Researching current policy issues, following up on the latest news, doing research and data collection on religious freedom, working on Alliance/Grassroots partner mobilization

CAPACITY BUILDING Supporting internal organizational capacity building, day-to-day operations, working on collecting and arranging data, and other duties.
